



ARCHERY RANGE RULES

- Right To Bear Arms Rules, as well as all Federal, State, and Local laws will be obeyed at all times.
- All archers must read and sign liability waiver before shooting privileges are granted.
- Alcoholic beverages and/or illegal drugs are prohibited on Right To Bear Arms property. The use of alcohol, illegal drugs, or legal drugs with the ability to cause impairment, prior to arrival at the archery range is prohibited. For the safety of our customers, Right To Bear Arms reserves the right to refuse service to anyone at any time, including for cause refusal such as: any person(s) smelling of alcohol or drugs, any person(s) who appears impaired upon arrival or participation. Any person(s) with the appearance of impairment or suspected influence of alcohol or drugs will be asked to leave Right To Bear Arms property and will not be allowed to enter the archery range.
- Persons must be 18 years of age or older to participate at the Right To Bear Arms Archery Range. Children between the ages of 12 to 17 will be allowed to enter the archery range and participate only under the supervision of a parent or guardian. **Children under 12 years of age may be permitted to enter the archery range and participate under the supervision of a parent or guardian provided proof of successful completion of hunters education class or accepted youth archery safety course is made available to Right To Bear Arms. The parent or guardian assumes all responsibility & liability for the participation of minors under their supervision at all times.
- Persons purchasing a Right To Bear Arms Membership understand that purchase of a Family Membership is limited to 4 persons & all must reside within the same household. Any person(s) found to be falsely representing household residence will be subject to voidance of their membership without refund.
- Photo identification is required for the use of all Right To Bear Arms range facilities. Identification will be collected and returned upon completion of archery range time.
- Treat all Right To Bear Arms property with respect. Theft and vandalism will be prosecuted.
- Check your equipment on a regular basis. If in doubt, have it checked by a professional before shooting.
- Persons must obey Right To Bear Arms Staff at all times. Failure to do so will result in immediate ejection from the range without refund. The commands of ALL RANGE STAFF IS FINAL.
- Be considerate of fellow shooters. No shooting across lanes, shooting other targets, distracting other archers at the shooting line or intentionally damaging other archer's equipment.
- Never step in front of the shooting line to retrieve arrows until range is clear.
- Archers may NOT use broad heads, unless using broad head targets.
- Absolutely no sky drawing. Bows are only to be drawn at the shooting line and in the direction of targets.
- RIGHT TO BEAR ARMS RESERVES THE RIGHT TO INSPECT ALL EQUIPMENT PRIOR TO ARCHERY RANGE ENTRY.
- Always practice good sportsmanship and use common sense. Safety is the number one rule to be practiced. Absolutely no horse play on the range.
- Use of tobacco products is prohibited on Right To Bear Arms property. This includes all cigarette varieties (including vapor and electronic cigarettes) as well as smokeless tobacco varieties.
- Food or drink consumption of any type, including chewing gum, candy, etc. is prohibited within the archery range.
- The archery range staff reserves the right to refuse service to any patron who violates any rule or regulation.
- Right To Bear Arms assumes NO RESPONSIBILITY for lost or stolen items. Personal items left unattended throughout the facility are at your own risk.
- Bows must be pointed down range at all times when arrow is on rest.
- Open toed shoes (sandals, flip flops, etc.) are not permitted in the archery range under any circumstances.
- All equipment, personal or assigned by Right To Bear should be kept to your area only.
- Make sure target area is clear of people before drawing bow.
- Do not nock an arrow until everyone is safely behind the shooting line.
- DO NOT run in Archery Range.
- Upon completion of archery range time, the following procedures should always be followed: clean up around your area by eliminating any trash and placing it in the receptacle provided. Promptly return to counter at the completion of your session so ID can be returned.

UPON LEAVING THE RANGE PLEASE INFORM RANGE STAFF OF ANY EQUIPMENT THAT DOES NOT APPEAR TO BE OPERATING PROPERLY.

FIRING RANGE RULES

- Right To Bear Arms Rules, as well as all Federal, State, and Local firearm laws will be obeyed at all times.
- Alcoholic beverages and/or illegal drugs are prohibited on Right To Bear Arms property. The use of alcohol, illegal drugs, or legal drugs with the ability to cause impairment, prior to arrival at the firing range is prohibited. For the safety of our customers, Right To Bear Arms reserves the right to refuse service to anyone at any time, including for cause refusal such as: any person(s) smelling of alcohol or drugs, any person(s) who appears impaired upon arrival or participation. Any person(s) with the appearance of impairment or suspected influence of alcohol or drugs will be asked to leave Right To Bear Arms property and will not be allowed to enter the firing range.
- Persons must be 18 years of age or older to participate at the Right To Bear Arms Firing Range. Children between the ages of 12 to 17 will be allowed to enter the firing range and participate only under the supervision of a parent or guardian. ****Children under 12 years of age may be permitted to enter the firing range and participate under the supervision of a parent or guardian provided proof of successful completion of hunters education class or accepted youth gun safety course is made available to Right To Bear Arms. The parent or guardian assumes all responsibility & liability for the participation of minors under their supervision at all times.**
- Persons purchasing a Right To Bear Arms Membership understand that purchase of a Family Membership is limited to 4 persons & all must reside within the same household. Any person(s) found to be falsely representing household residence of family members will be subject to voidance of their membership without refund.
- Photo identification is required for the use of all Right To Bear Arms range facilities. Identification will be collected prior to range session & returned upon completion of firing range time.
- **NO PREGNANT WOMEN ALLOWED IN THE FIRING RANGE AT ANY TIME DUE TO HEALTH CONCERNS.**
- Right To Bear Arms Management assumes NO RESPONSIBILITY for any mishandling of firearms or unsafe handling of personal equipment or that of Right To Bear Arms.
****FIREARMS SHOULD BE HANDLED AS IF THEY ARE LOADED AT ALL TIMES.****
- Persons must obey Right To Bear Arms Firing Range Staff at all times. Failure to do so will result in immediate ejection from the range without refund. The commands of ALL RANGE OFFICERS ARE FINAL.
- If a “CEASE FIRE” is announced, all persons must IMMEDIATELY STOP SHOOTING, LOWER & CLEAR WEAPON, PLACE FIREARM ON BENCH WITH BARREL POINTED DOWN RANGE & MOVE BACK FROM THE FIRING LINE until further instruction is received.
- RIGHT TO BEAR ARMS RESERVES THE RIGHT TO INSPECT ALL FIREARMS, AMMUNITION, CALIBER, AND EQUIPMENT PRIOR TO FIRING RANGE ENTRY.
- For your safety, Ear and Eye Protection is required at all times while in the firing range area, including spectators. Personal equipment is acceptable, subject to inspection. Right To Bear Arms also offers ear and eye protection to purchase for your convenience.
- Use of tobacco products is prohibited on Right To Bear Arms property. This includes all cigarette varieties (including vapor and electronic cigarettes) as well as smokeless tobacco varieties.
- Food or drink consumption of any type, including chewing gum, candy, etc. is prohibited within the firing range.
- Only two persons are permitted in a shooting booth at any given time. ONLY ONE SHOOTER AT A TIME.
- **NO PERSON IS ALLOWED FORWARD OF THE FIRING LINE AT ANY TIME, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.**

- Right To Bear Arms assumes NO RESPONSIBILITY for lost or stolen items. Firearm equipment and/or personal items left unattended throughout the facility are at your own risk.
- All firearms must be cleared and action open when removed from the firing lane.
- Should any problem occur while firing a weapon, leave the jammed/malfunctioning firearm pointed down range and immediately contact a Right To Bear Arms Range Officer for support.
- All persons utilizing the Right To Bear Arms firing range should be sure to use the correct ammunition for their weapon. Factory produced brass casing ammunition is permitted for use in the range. Reloaded ammunition is permitted, subject to inspection by Right to Bear Arms prior to firing. Steel shot is prohibited. Tracers, & explosive or armor piercing ammunition is strictly prohibited. Muzzleloaders are prohibited. Shot guns are permitted with slugs only.
****Right To Bear Arms retains the right to discretionally refuse the use of any ammunition for the safety of all firing range occupants.**
- Persons are permitted to pick-up their own brass casings under the following conditions: (1) Brass pick-up is permitted behind the firing line within your assigned booth ONLY. (2) Brass pick-up is completed during your allotted range time. **Extra time following your assigned range session will NOT be permitted for brass pick-up. Please plan accordingly.
- No more than one loaded firearm is permitted in a booth at a time. If a person(s) is carrying concealed during their firing range time, the concealed weapon must be announced to the Range Officer prior to or upon range entry.
- Open toed shoes (sandals, flip flops, etc.) are not permitted in the firing range under any circumstances.
- All equipment, personal or assigned by Right To Bear Arms, should be kept to your assigned booth only.
- Firearms should be loaded and unloaded in your booth only, with the barrel of the gun pointed down range at all times.
- Cross-lane firing or firing at anything other than your own target in your assigned lane is strictly prohibited. Any persons found to be noncompliant with this policy &/or found to be guilty of any type of vandalism within Right To Bear Arms will be subject to appropriate disciplinary action, including immediate ejection from the Right To Bear Arms facility and up to potential for being barred from future use of Right To Bear Arms facilities, and report to the proper authorities for appropriate action. All persons will be held accountable for their actions and WILL pay for any damages incurred as the result of neglect of firing range rules and/or firing range misuse and abuse.
- Draw and fire practice is not allowed in the Right To Bear Arms firing range.
- Upon completion of firing range time, the following procedures should always be followed: unload your weapon, pack up your unloaded firearm and any additional equipment, clean up around your booth by eliminating any trash from the area and placing it in the receptacle provided. Promptly return to the counter at the completion of your session to turn in any rented equipment for your range time & obtain ID.

UPON LEAVING THE RANGE PLEASE INFORM RANGE OFFICER OF ANY EQUIPMENT THAT DOES NOT APPEAR TO BE OPERATING PROPERLY.
